Covid-19 Planning — Arriving and picking up your child

The first day for pupils is Wednesday 2nd September. Each class will have their own start and pick up times. The classrooms will be their own bubble and entry door will be the outside classroom fire doors (for the infants) and the normal doors for Year 3-6. The one-way system will continue around the school. School uniform will be required as from September.

Staff will be in attendance at the drop off and pick up points to ensure that parents can deliver and collect children safely. If there are more people waiting to get in, please leave at least a metre between you. If you have children in more than one class, please use the earlier drop off and later pick up slot for both/all children. This term parents will not be allowed in school and any communications with the office need to be via email or phone.

The **no-cars policy on Wetherleigh Drive** which begun on the 1st June has been an important part of our safe pick up process. It enables those picking up to socially distance and ensure the safety of our pupils. Your help with this has been appreciated. We are aware that for some this won't be possible due to health concerns but please ensure no cars come past the final cul-de-sac before school and between 3-3:20pm.

Measures taken at school:

The classrooms will hopefully not look too different to normal, however, children will still need to keep together in their own bubble. They will not be able to mix with other classes during the day; separate lunchtimes and playground spaces will be allocated, along with a one-way system in school. There will be no collective worships in the hall although we may have some outside if the weather is suitable.

If we are concerned about any child with possible Covid19 symptoms, we will be isolating the child with an adult wearing PPE, then asking the parents to collect. Parents will need to arrange for the child to be tested in line with government policy. The results of this test must then be shown to the school staff to able re-entry to school.

Response to any infection will require us to:

- engage with the NHS Test and Trace process
- manage confirmed cases of coronavirus (COVID-19) amongst the school community
- contain any outbreak by following local health protection team advice

We will continue to use hand sanitiser on entry to school. Please ensure we have your most up to date telephone numbers and that you answer any calls received from school during the day.

Regular handwashing, respiratory hygiene, bubble classes, playground zones and extensive cleaning will be some of the key measures employed by the academy to prevent virus transmission. This will follow the updated risk assessments, put in place for the 1st September.

Lunch times:

At lunch time, all pupils will have packed lunches. For those pupils on Free School Meals and in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2, these will be provided if required. For all others, or those in Reception, Year 1 and Year 2 who choose to, please bring a packed lunch. There will be no hot lunches available at this time and we will review this again by October half term.

Education:

'Reconnection Curriculum' The will be implemented this term which will focus on our provision around a Personal, Social, Health Education curriculum supporting all pupils. We also plan to identify gaps in children's education in an empathic manner so that we can use monies allocated by the government to support areas of need. It is important that the pupils are compliant to the appendix of the behaviour policy regarding Coronavirus and if they are not able to do this, parents will be asked to collect their child immediately. We have to make the safety of all children a priority during these times.

Extra Curricular Clubs

Sadly, there will be a very reduced provision of clubs. There will be the **AR club** in the morning for pupils in Years 3-6 and more information about clubs will be shared in the first week back.

Mrs Tirel will support the groups Mon-Weds and Miss Coldrick on a Thursday morning.
