

## **Update on COVID Measures**

Unfortunately, we have seen on a very real level that the pandemic is far from over. Whilst we had quite a number of cases in October and November, as I write this, we have two confirmed cases of COVID in the school, plus some pupils awaiting PCR results. We hope that this number remains low. However, we must remain vigilant and take extra care, especially in light of the recent news of a new strain of the virus.

Within school, we continue with many of the mitigations we've put in place. Our aim is to maintain the safety of the whole of the Highnam community and we will, as always, work as a collective to do that. To that end, can I remind all parents and carers that when they enter the school for any reason, they should be wearing a mask unless medically exempt. We also highly recommend the wearing of masks for drop off and pick up times, especially when gathering around areas that are potentially busy, such as the school gates and outside the classrooms.

In terms of our Christmas productions, we have made the difficult decision to make the junior carol service virtual. The children will still go to the church on the afternoon of Monday 6<sup>th</sup> December; we will record the service and share the link with you. For the infant nativity, provided the number of positive cases within our school remains low, and there are no further restrictions or guidance from the Department for Education, then we will go ahead with this in school (9.30am on Tuesday 14<sup>th</sup> and Wednesday 15<sup>th</sup> December). Sadly, we have had to limit the numbers for these performances. We also ask adults to wear masks. We will keep windows open to ensure there is good ventilation and we have also arranged to use an air filter system for each performance.

We hope you understand the reason for these decisions, and we apologise for any disappointment it may cause.

### **Charities**

We had a great day raising money for Children in Need and raised an impressive £771 through our non-uniform day and selling a range of merchandise. Thank you to Pudsey Bear and the volunteers from Newent and District Rotary Club who came to visit all the children.





The Gloucester Foodbank also wanted to pass on their appreciation for the harvest donations they received in October. In total, Highnam provided them with nearly 50kg worth of food. Thank you to everyone who helped to support these worthwhile charities. Your generosity will benefit so many who are in need.
