Highlights from this Term

In January, the children in key stage 2 were fortunate enough to be joined by Cain Webb and Helen Gregory. Cain, who is 21 years old and lives in Gloucester, has cerebral palsy. Along with Helen, who supports him, he visits local schools with the aim of teaching children about what it's like to live with a disability and how he overcomes daily challenges.





We gained so much from their visit: we all had the opportunity to try writing our name using just our feet and some children were challenged to put on a t-shirt using only one arm. The highlight of the session was watching some of the children feeding the teachers yoghurt! All of this was to demonstrate how hard the simple, everyday things can be for someone with a disability.

Cain answered the children's questions and communicated through his AAC, which is his computer that he controls with his eyes. He told us that the worst thing about his disability is being stared at when he is out and about. We were taught about things we can do to support people who are disabled, mainly to be respectful and friendly, to smile and say hello but never to stare.





Our time with Cain and Helen helped us to see that despite the challenges, living with a disability can be a source of strength and resilience. It can also be an opportunity to help others who are in similar situations. Cain's positive, 'can-do' attitude and wonderful sense of humour is an example to us all.



A visit from Miss Read!

What a pleasure it was to welcome Miss Read (now Mrs Fitzsimons) to our school. Some of you may remember that after teaching at Highnam, she moved to Mozambique to work with the charity I Reach Africa. This was over five years ago!

During her visit, she spent some time in class and she led an assembly to update the children on the schools she works at in Mozambique. It was fascinating to hear about a day in the life of a Mozambican child and really opened our eyes to similarities and differences to life here in the UK.

Young Voices

Taking part in Young Voices, the largest children's choir in the world, has to be one of the highlights of the school year for many of the children (and staff)! This year, we had the privilege of singing 'Proud' with Heather Small from M People as well as performing a whole range of songs including 'Don't Worry' by Bob Marley and traditional songs such as 'Over the Hills and Far Away'. Throughout the concert, the children sang and danced with wonderful energy and gusto, behaved impeccably and represented the school brilliantly.
